REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION

OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Royal Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Royal Kennel Club Rule A11.
 - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11.
2.
 - (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the Board.
 - (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Royal Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the Board to deceive.
4. The Board without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority, who shall have a written directive from the Royal Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Royal Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Royal Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

The Officers and Committee do not accept responsibility for any products advertised or sold by Stall Holders and/or Trade Stands at this Show. Exhibitors are reminded that products on sale by Trade Stands for the preparation and grooming of dogs may not meet the requirements for the preparation of dogs for exhibition as stated above.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show Award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by Royal The Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in Breed Classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must, at the time of entry, be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the first closing date of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 25th April 2026.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

WITHDRAWAL The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F(1).19.

TRANSFER (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

(b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height, and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

(c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

(d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

With the above provisos the following are the definitions of certain classes:

MINOR PUPPY	For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 9 calendar months of age on the first day of the show.
PUPPY	For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 12 calendar months of age on the first day of the show.
JUNIOR	For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show.
YEARLING	For dogs of 12 and not exceeding 24 calendar months of age on the first day of the show.
MAIDEN	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or a first prizes at Open or Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
NOVICE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more first prizes at Open or Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
POST GRADUATE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more first prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
LIMIT	For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won three or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won seven or more first prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
OPEN	For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.
VETERAN	For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the show.
NOT FOR COMPETITION	Societies may, at their discretion, accept not for competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

YOUR JUDGES

DOGS - SANDRA CARTER

I have been showing and breeding Staffordshire Bull Terriers since 1999. My affix is Shortyrook Staffords. Shortyrook Staffords have 9 Best in Specialty show winning dogs, 2 Best in Show winning and 2 Reserve Best in Show winners.

We have won 7 times the Top Twenty Stafford Competition for the Staffordshire Bull Terrier Club of America with 4 different dogs: GRCHS BIS MBISS Shortyrooks Jasper of Dumbriton, GRCHS BIS MRBIS MBISS Seenworstaffs Lucky Me (UK Import), GRCH RBIS MBISS Shortyrooks The Vindicator, and GRCH Shortyrooks Sweet Sweet Connie in 2025. The Staffordshire Bull Terrier Club of America has rewarded us with 2 National specialty winners CH Thrashers Reba Realdamcute and CH Thrashers Elliott Eversohandsome.

I have served as SBTCA president and area director, mentor and Judges Education Committee.

I have judged the following Specialty shows in Santa Barbara, California, Oregon, Washington, Stafford Roulette Utah, Alaska Outpost Specialty, Northeast Stafford Specialty, Canadian National Specialty, South Australia, Area 2 Southern Specialty, Amana Specialty, Swords Ireland Championship Show.

I am a retired Orange County Public School teacher and have moved from Florida to Oregon to be close to my 6 grandchildren.

BITCHES - SHAUN STONE

Shaun has grown up with Staffords and attended shows since a young age. Around 1996 he started to show and, along with his parents, they got their Ashbull affix.

Most notably, dogs I have bred, owned and shown are Ch Knockon Yes You at Ashbull JW, RIP Ch Ashbull O'Shea, USA/Polish Ch Ashbull O'Driscoll at Matt-Staffs, UK Swed/Nor Ch Zakstaff Rumour Has It JW plus many more and currently campaigning Tillcarr Heart Of Fire (RCC).

My first judging appointment was in 2000 and I first awarded CCs in the UK in 2016.

This will be my 6th CC appointment for our beloved breed in the UK and I'm looking forward and honoured to judge the Merseyside SBTC Ch Show.

SHOW REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 9.00 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.00 a.m.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. Entry fees: First entry Members £13.00, Non-members £15.00; Subsequent entries £2.00 per class same dog, Veteran class FREE per dog, Not for Competition £1.00 per dog.
6. No Prize Money will be offered at this show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
10. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled, the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Similarly if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show. The selection of Best in Show may follow the selection of Best Puppy in Show and Best Veteran in Show (if scheduled) respectively. A Baby Puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Any Variety Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Best Baby Puppy in Breed may be declared in each breed from the dogs entered in the Baby Puppy breed classes. There must be no progression to further competition.
11. **BEST IN SHOW** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Royal Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Royal Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a RKC Authority To Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an ATC number will be returned to the exhibitor.
16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Royal Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at R.K.C. licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Right to refuse entries. Exhibitors/competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Royal Kennel Club Regulations to refuse any entry.

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Royal Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Royal Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Royal Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Royal Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Royal Kennel Club registered.
19. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the Board of the Royal Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
20. All entries must be made on or before the closing date for entries (Postmark) upon the entry forms enclosed for that purpose. All entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate entry fees or the entry will not be accepted.
21. If acknowledgement of entries is required a S.A.E. should be enclosed.
22. Should a judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement the Committee reserves to itself the right of appointing another judge to fulfil the duty. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from the competition but no entry fees can be refunded.
23. No animal other than an exhibit shall be brought into the precincts of a Dog Show during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board of the Royal Kennel Club. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
24. Exhibitors showing dogs are not permitted to hold any conversation with the judge during the competition, and any exhibitor who persists in addressing the judge after being requested not to do so by the ring steward, the judge or any member of the Committee may be disqualified and reported to the Royal Kennel Club, and any prize awarded to his or her dogs may be forfeited. No person other than the exhibitor (officials excepted) will be in the ring during judging.
25. The Show Manager shall have the power to exclude or remove any dog which is, in his opinion, owing to disease, savage disposition or any other cause, not in a fit state for exhibition. Once a dog has been refused admission or has been removed from the show owing to disease, savage disposition or any other cause, it shall not be brought into the show at any time under any circumstances, and the case must be reported to the Royal Kennel Club within seven days.
26. The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of dogs sent for exhibition, but it must be clearly understood that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss or detention of or damage to a dog or dogs, boxers, hampers, collars or any other property whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever nor for any act or omission of themselves, their officers, agents, servants and others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are accepted.
27. The Officers & Committee of the show accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by standholders at the show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulation for Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
28. **DOG FOULING**
 - a. Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Royal Kennel Club Licensed Show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
 - b. Any organisation holding a Royal Kennel Club Licensed event is required to provide an adequate number of receptacles for the disposal of such fouling.

I/We declare that where any alteration has been made to the natural conformation of the dog(s) the relevant permission to show has been granted by the Royal Kennel Club.
